Connect

Construct

- Design and make a security-control area for passengers to go through before boarding their planes.




Suggested model solution

Contemplate

- Have the children role-play the actions taken at security control. Which members of staff are involved and what are their functions?
- Discuss with the children how going through a security-control area will show airport guards what people are carrying with them, including items they are not allowed to carry on board. Talk about sounds, computers, screens, monitors, detectors, and so on.
- Ask the children what cannot be taken through security control.

Continue

- After passing through security control, passengers have to carry their hand luggage, which can sometimes be pretty heavy. Design and make a luggage cart with wheels to help passengers transport their luggage around the airport.
- After having checked in and gone through security control, passengers often have to wait a long time. Design and make a rest area with sofas, chairs, and tables.
